The bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Charles county to assess and levy a sum of money on the assessable property thereof, for the purpose of building a jail in said county, was read the second time and passed.

THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of George P. Hinckle, report, That they have taken the same under their consid. eration, and find, that some time in the year seventeen hundred and ninety, the said Hinckle, by virtue of an assignment obtained from Thomas Beall (of Samuel,) had a survey made of twenty six and an half acres of land, and called the same "Walnut Pla ns." That several years afterwards he applied for a patent, which was refused him, upon the ground of the assignment from Beall being ille-This laid him under the necessity of getting out a gal and void. fresh warrant and surveying the land anew; but during the period between the first and second survey, having made some improvements, and it not appearing reasonable that the state should take advantage of the defect in his first title, and reap the benefit of the labor of this individual, we beg leave to submit the following resolution lution:

Resolved, That George Plummer Hinckle of Allegany county be, and he is hereby released from the payment of fourteen dollars, sixteen cents and two thirds of a cent, the valuation of certain improvements returned in a certificate of survey made for the said Hinckle, called "Walnut Plains," and bearing date the seventh day of November eighteen hundred and eleven; and that the treasurer of the Western Shore, upon the payment of the caution money, receipt for the same in full upon the said certificate; and that patent may issue thereupon; the other rules and regulations of the land office in such cases being fully complied with.
