THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Donaldson, Sanders and Harryman. And a petition from John Bufum of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, T. B. Hall and Pechin.

Mr. Downey delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Washington county, praying for the decrease of useless dogs; which was read and referred to Messrs. Downey, T. B. Hall, Sanders, Groome and Marriott.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from Robert D. Allen, of the city of Baltimore, an alien, praying his title to certain real property may be confirmed; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Randall and Pechin.

Mr. Bowles delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Boonsborough in Washington county, praying for a lottery to build a
