

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

The bill for the relief of William R. Gillis, James Gillis and David Gillis, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Moffitt delivers a bill entitled, An act to give validity and operation to the deed of conveyance therein mentioned; and a bill entitled, An act empowering the justices of the levy court of Cecil county to appoint commissioners to review, alter and amend the road therein mentioned; which were read.

The bill relating to the hospital in the vicinity of the city of Baltimore was read the second time; and on motion by Mr. Bowles, the question was put, That the words "annually for three years," be stricken out of the clause appropriating 5000 dollars to said hospital out of the treasury?

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of John Hassard and Ralph Hassard of the city of Baltimore. The supplement to the act authorising commissioners to make sale of the land of which William Warman Berry died possessed. The bill to change the sur-name of Charles Perry, of Dorchester county, and his children to the name of Lowe; and the bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed.

The house, according to the order of the day, resumed the consideration of the additional supplement to the act entitled, An act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts. And on motion by Mr. Donaldson, the question was put, That the words "with the exception of Baltimore county court?" be inserted in the first clause after the words "the several county courts of this state."
