

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 6, 1811.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill to empower the justices of the levy court of Cecil county to appoint commissioners to review, alter and amend the road therein mentioned.—The bill to prevent the opening a road in Baltimore county.—The bill to appoint Richard Hall Harwood, trustee for the sale of part of the real estate of Jonathan Selman, deceased.—The bill for the relief of John Fisher of Caroline county; and the resolution in favor of Robert Walters, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Wilson delivers a bill entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Worcester county. Mr. Donaldson delivers a bill entitled: An act authorising appropriations for the penitentiary of this state. Mr. Bœrstler delivers a bill entitled, An act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state; and Mr. Griffith delivers a bill entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned; which were severally read.

The bill to regulate the inspection of lumber was read the second time; and on motion by Mr. Donaldson, the question was put, That the words "appoint four or more inspectors of lumber for the city and county of Baltimore," be stricken out of the first clause, giving the appointment of inspectors to the governor and council. The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:
