

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 7, 1811.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the relief of William Greetham, of the city of Baltimore; the bill to authorise a lottery for the purpose therein mentioned, in Washington county; the bill for the relief of Elizabeth Ratcliff, of Charles county; and the bill to increase the allowance of the justices of the orphans' court of the counties therein mentioned, with the message requesting a re-consideration thereof, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Frisby delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of James Cruickshanks of Kent county; which was read.

Mr. Harryman delivers a bill entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Jonathan Cullings; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from the female contributors of the Humane Impartial Society of the city of Baltimore, praying to be incorporated; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Pechin and Harryman.

Mr. Harryman has leave of absence.

Mr. Randall delivers a petition from Ebenezer Finley, of the city of Baltimore, praying that the interest on a balance due him by the levy court of said county may be paid; which was read and referred to Messrs. Randall, Brown and Donaldson.

The Speaker laid before the house a report from the clerk of the court of appeals for the Eastern Shore; and Mr. Bowles delivers a report from the clerk of Washington county, relative to the attendance of the judges; which were read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

The bill for the appointment by the people, of the justices of the levy courts in the several counties of this state, was sent to the senate.

The bill for the relief of Thomas Dempsey, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the further supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county and for other purposes; the bill for the relief of William Taylor, of Worcester county; and the bill to prevent the opening a road in Baltimore county, severally endorsed "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. The bill for the benefit of John Reardon, of Harford county, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, agreed to and the bill ordered to be engrossed. The bill to make valid a deed from Daniel Shaw of Baltimore county, to George Elliott of same county; and the bill for the sale of the real estate of Abraham Larsh, late of Baltimore county, deceased; severally endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read.
