Mr. Sanders delivers a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of the heirs of James Cain, late of Harford county, deceased; which was read.

The amendments proposed to the bill for the sale of the real estate of Abraham Larsh, late of Baltimore county, deceased; were read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill for the relief of Sater T. Walker, an insolvent debtor, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Evans delivers a bill antitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act to ascertain the allowance to jurymen and witnesses of the general court, and several county and orphans' courts in this state; which was read.

The bill to appoint Thomas Harrison, of the city of Annapolis, trustee for the sale of certain real estate therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Randall, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act authorising the justices of the levy court for Baltimore county to lease and exchange the property therein mentioned. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Randall, Brown and Harryman be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Randall delivers a petition from Robert Bingham, and Andrew and William Cross, counter to the petition of William Slater; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to pay the civil list and other expenses of civil government, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. L. Duvall delivers a bill entitled, An act to make valid a certain devise to the Methodist church in the city of Annapolis; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Baltimore county to appoint supervisors on the roads therein mentioned, and to repeal the act entitled, An act relating to the criminals in Baltimore county; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Swearingen, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to regulate constables fees in the several counties therein mentioned. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Swearingen, Bowles and Smoot be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Ireland delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of James Dixon, of Calvert county; which was read.
