

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 10, 1811.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. John R. Pater, a delegate returned for Saint Mary's county appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking an oath to support the constitution of the United States, took his seat in the house.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Humane Impartial Society of the city of Baltimore; which was read the first and second time by special order; passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Swearingen delivers a petition from Ignatius Davis, of Frederick county, praying he may be authorised to erect a mill on the river Monocasy, with the consent of the president and directors of the Potomac company; which was read and referred to Messrs. Swearingen, Bowles, Downey, Jones and Howard.

Mr. Downey delivers a petition from Daniel Hifflebower, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Downey, Boerstler and T. B. Hall.

Mr. Belt delivers a petition from Rachel Mewshaw, of Anne-Arundel county, praying to be supported by said county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Belt, A. Dorsey and Z. Duvall.

Mr. Pechin delivers a petition from the elders, trustees and church wardens of the German Lutheran congregation, praying that contracts made by them may be confirmed; which was read and referred to Messrs. Pechin, Randall and Donaldson.

Mr. H. Hall delivers a petition from Isaac Perryman, of Harford county, praying to be remunerated his expenses in keeping two runaway negroes, before they were in a condition to be removed to the county jail; which was read and referred to Messrs. H. Hall, Sanders and Forwood.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from the managers of the Library company of the city of Baltimore, praying for a lottery for the benefit thereof; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Pechin and Frisby.

Mr. Callis delivers a petition from Elisha Berry, of Prince George's county, praying that the sur-name of Elisha Ferguson may be changed to Berry; which was read and referred to Messrs. Callis, Herbert and Somervell.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of the city of Baltimore, praying that the salary of the chief justice of the court of oyer and terminer, and jail delivery, for Baltimore county, may be increased; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, R. Neale, Sanders, Marriott and Frisby; and a statement from sundry inhabitants of the city of Baltimore, in favor of George W. Moore, which was read and ordered to lie on the table.
