The bill to lay out and open a road from Harrison Haddaway's land, to the main road leading from Easton to Knapp's narrows, in Talbot county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act authorising the justices of the levy court of Baltimore county, to lease and exchange the property therein mentioned; which was read the first and second time by special order; passed and sent to the senate.

The bill to authorise Joseph Greenwalt and Emanuel Brower, of Frederick county, to sell and convey certain land therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. T. B. Hall delivers a bill entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Washington county; which was read.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of John Fisher, of Caroline county. The bill to authorise a lottery or lotteries in the city of Baltimore; and the bill for the relief of John Buffum, of the city of Baltimore; severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. The bill to incorporate the Humane Impartial society of the city of Baltimore; and the bill to appoint Richard Hall Harwood, trustee for the sale of part of the real estate of Jonathan Sellman, deceased, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, agreed to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. And the resolution in favor of George P. Hinckle; endorsed, "assented to."

On motion by Mr. Jackson, the question was put, That leave be given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to incorporate a bank to be called the Farmers' Bank of Somerset and Worcester counties.
