day.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the relief of John M. Kenzie; the bill authorising the levy court of Prince George's county, to open a road in said county; and the further supplement to the act entitled, An act authorising the drawing of a lottery for the benefit of the College of Medicine of Maryland; were sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of Henry Shræder; the bill empowering the surveyors of the several counties of this state and their deputies to qualify their chain and pole carriers; and the bill to make valid a certain devise to the Nethedist church in the city of Annapolis; severally endorsed "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Frisby delivers a bill entitled, "An act annulling the marriage of John Lamb, of Kent county, and Elizabeth his wife;

which was read.

The bill to appoint commissioners to open a road in Worcester county; was read the second time and passed.
