

Mr. Wainwright delivers a petition from Nathan G. Bryson and wife praying for the sale of the real estate of Bennet Wheeler, deceased, for the benefit of his infant children; which was read and referred to Messrs. Wainwright, Stevens and Tenant.

The Speaker laid before the house a letter from the register of the land office for the Western Shore, enclosing an account and receipt for taxes received by him as such; which was read.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of the trustees of the Male Free School of Baltimore; which was read.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a bill entitled, An act for opening and extending Saint Paul's street in the city and precincts of Baltimore; and Mr. Swearingen delivers a bill entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, An act to establish a market in Frederick-town in Frederick county and for the regulation of the said market; which were severally read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

M. L. Duvall delivers a bill entitled, An act for the encouragement of learning and erecting schools in the several counties within this state; which was read. *Ordered*, That the same have a second reading on Monday next.

The bill for the relief of James Keys, an insolvent debtor of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill to authorise a lottery or lotteries to raise a sum of money for the use of the Library Company of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of Rachel Mewshaw; the bill to change the mode of repairing the public roads in Worcester county; the bill for the benefit of James Cochran; and the bill for the relief of James Dixon; severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. The bill to authorise Joseph Greenawalt and Emanuel Brower of Frederick county, to sell and convey certain land therein mentioned; and the bill for the relief of Charles Farrow, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendments were read, agreed to and the bills ordered to be engrossed. Also, the bill to prevent the erection of booths within two miles of any methodist camp or quarterly meeting in the several counties therein mentioned; and the further supplement to the act entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned; severally endorsed, "will not pass."

Mr. Evans delivers the following report:

THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of James Walker, of Montgomery county, praying to be supported as an outpensioner, report, That they have taken the same into consideration, and are of opinion that the trustees of the poor for Montgomery county are the proper persons for the petitioner to apply to for relief; they therefore recommend that he have leave to withdraw his petition.
