Mr. Emory delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Queen Anne's county, praying that the orphans' court may have the power of decreeing the sale of infants' estates; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a Carpenters' Hall in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. T. Jones delivers a bill entitled, A Supplement to an act entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of making a permanent bridge over the river Monocacy in Frederick county; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Street delivers a petition from Sedgwick James, of Harford county, praying to be refunded the caution-money paid by him for land which was included in an elder survey; which was read and referred to Messrs. Street, Sanders and Forwood.

Mr. Reynolds delivers a petition from Sutton I. Weems, of Calvert county, praying indulgence, and to be released from the additional nine per cent interest on a debt due by him to the state; which was read and referred to Messrs. Reynolds, Grahame and Emerson.

Mr. Grahame delivers a petition from Thomas Parran, of Calvert county, a revolutionary soldier, praying relief; which was read and referred to Messrs. Grahame, Emerson and Reynolds.

On motion by Mr. Donaldson, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An additional supplement to an act entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Donaldson, Harryman and Pechin be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill annulling the marriage of Samuel Sargent and Mary his wife, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and will not pass.

Mr. Randall delivers the bill to appoint commissioners to grade, level, pave and repair the streets, squares, lanes and alleys in that part of the eastern precincts of the city of Baltimore therein described, as amended; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.
