Mr. Harryman delivers the following report:

The bill relating to public roads in Harford county, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Street, the question was put, That the words "Harford county" be stricken out of the title for the purpose of inserting the words, "the several counties of this state?" Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Street, the further consideration of the same

was postponed.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a bill entitled, An additional supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a bill entitled, An act to annul the marriage of John Henry Hoskyns, and Anne his wife; which was

read.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of James Davidson Johnson, of Worcester county; the bill to appoint commissioners to open a road in Worcester county; and the bill to change the name of Georgetown Cross Roads, in Kent county, severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. the bill to change and alter the name of Elisha Furguson, of Prince George's county, to Elisha Berry; and the bill authorising the levy court of Prince George's county to open a road in said countv. severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read. Also the bill to appoint Thomas Harrison of the city of Annapolis, trustee for the sale of certain real estate therein mentioned; and the further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act to ascertain the allowance to jurymen and witnesses of the general court, and the several county and orphans' courts in this state; severally endorsed " will not pass."

On motion of Mr. R. Neale, Ordered, That the act entitled, An act to repeal the fourth and fifth section of an act entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, be immediately published in the Maryland Gazette and Maryland Republican, and continued once a week for
