a remuneration for his care, atte tion and expenses to these negroes, (the property of the state,) recommend the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Iseac Perryman, of Harford county, or to his order, the sum of fifty dollars, as a compensation for the care, trouble and expense of the said Isaac Perryman, incurred by him in nursing and maintaining negroes John and Charles, condemned by Queen Anne's county count to work and labor on the public roads in Baltimore county, and who made their escape from Baltimore before they were delivered to the proper officer who was authorised to receive them.

Mr. Stevens delivers the bill for the valuation of real and personal

property in this state as amended; which was read.

The bill to incorporate a company for building a bridge over Chop-tank river at or near Denton ferry, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. T. N. Williams, Ordered, Thas the bill to empower the levy courts of Worcester and Anne Arundel counties to seil the ware-houses in said counties, be re-comm tied.

Mr. Plater delivers a petition from Councilius Manning, of Saint Mary's county, praying to be refunded for the deficiency found on a survey of the land purchased by his father of the state; which was read and referred to Messrs. Plater, R. Neale and H. Neale.

On motion by Mr. Callis, the amendments proposed to the bill authorising the levy court of Prince George's county to open a road in said county, and the bill to alter the name of Elisha Furguson of Prince George's county to Elisha Berry, were read the second time, agreed to and the bills ordered to be ever seed.

Mr. T. N. Williams delivers the bill to empower the levy court of Worcester county to sell the ware houses in said county, as amended; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill to make public a road in Charles and Saint Mary's counties, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Ja-

cob Bantz, of the city of Baltimore; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Donaldson, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act for the relief of Lemuel Warfield, of the city of Baltimore. Ordered, That Messrs. Donaldson, Jackson and Marriott be a committee to prepare and bring in the same. Mr. Donaldson delivers the said bill; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.
