THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of sundry inhabitants of Frederick and Baltimore counties, praying for the incorporation of a company for the purpose of making a turnpike road from Baltimore city to Liberty Town in Frederick county, beg leave to report, That they have had the same under consideration, and taken the benefit and disadvantages likely to result therefrom into mature reflection, and are of opinion that to turnpike the said road at this time is unnecessary and highly improper.

*Resolved*, That Edward Reynolds, executor of Thomas Reynolds, and Richard Mackall, surviving executor of Benjamin Mackall, of Calvert county, shall be authorised to lay before the auditor their claim, as executors aforesaid, against the late William and Robert Mollison ; and the auditor is hereby authorised and empowered to liquidate and adjust the same, and to ascertain the balance, if any, due thereon, to the said Edward Reynolds, executor of Thomas Reynolds, and Richard Mackall, surviving executor of the said Benjamin Mackall ; and the treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to pay to the said Edward Reynolds, executor of Thomas Reynolds, and Richard Mackall, surviving executor of Benjamin Mackall, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the amount of the balance so to be ascertained by the auditor : *Provided*, the sum so to be paid by the treasurer shall not exceed the balance now in the treasury arising from the sale of the property of the said William and Robert Mollison.
