Mr. Groome delivers a petition from Sampson G. Heyland, of Cecil county, praying that his title to negroes acquired by his wife, who executed a deed of manumission for the same before her marriage, and which had only one witness to its execution, may be confirmed ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Groome, Donaldson, Wainwright, Street and L. Duvall.

Mr. L. Duvall delivers the following report :

THE Committee to whom was referred the representation of Jehu Chandler, printer to the state, beg leave to report, That they have had the same under consideration, and are of opinion that in consequence of the extra services required by a resolution passed the present session, the additional expenses in the performance of his duties entitle him to further remuneration ; they therefore recommend the following resolution :

*Resolved*, That the governor and council cause such sum to be paid to Jehu Chandler, in addition to his present salary, as to them may appear reasonable, in consideration of any additional services required in conformity to a resolution passed the present session, requiring certain duties not heretofore required ; and that the treasurer pay such sum to the order of the governor and council, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Which was read.

On motion by Mr. Randall, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act to establish a market-house in the Eastern precincts of Baltimore, and for the regulation of the same ; *Ordered*, That Messrs. Randall, Donaldson and Harryman be a committee to prepare and bring in the same. Mr. Randall delivers the said bill ; which was read.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the encouragement of learning in Cecil county, endorsed " will pass ;" ordered to be engrossed. Also, the further supplement to an act entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, endorsed " will pass with the proposed amendment ;" which amendment was read, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. And a bill entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company, under the name of The Cumberland Bank of Allegany ; which was read.

The supplement to the act entitled, An act to direct descents, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The report on the petition of Jubb Fowler, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. L. Duvall, the question was put, That the blank in the resolution be filled up with the words " one hundred dollars ?" Determined in the negative. The question was then put on " seventy-five dollars ?" Determined in the ne-
