petitioner by the state, through the medium of the chancellor, for the said land containing one hundred and eight and a fourth acres, as by reference to the deed herewith produced will appear; your committee conceiving that it is right, just and proper, that the said John Norris should be refunded the expenses incurred by him in prosecuting the said suit against the state; recommend the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to

John Norris of Harford county, or to his order, the sum of

being the costs incurred by him in prosecuting a suit in the high court of chancery against the state of Maryland, to stay proceedings at law against the said John Norris and Jacob Norris. (which said Jacob is since dead,) upon a judgment obtained against them in the late general court, upon a bond given by them to the state for land purchased from the said state, and in which by a decree of the court of chancery there appeared to be a deficiency.
