

property of said county, a sum of money to build a bridge over the Great falls of Gunpowder; the bill to lay out and open a road in Washington county; and the supplement to an act entitled, An act for the regulating writs of error and granting appeals from and to the courts of common law within this province, severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. Also, the supplement to the act entitled, An act for regulating the mode of staying execution, passed at November session, 1791; endorsed, "will not pass." Also, a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments; and a bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, severally endorsed, "will pass;" which were read.

On motion by Mr. Bowles, *Ordered*, That the resolution relative to investments be postponed.

The report on the petition of Thomas Parran, of Calvert county was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to and sent to the senate.

The bill for the relief of Upton Ross, of Calvert county was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The supplement to the act entitled, An act to provide for the organization of the courts of common law in this state, and for the administration of justice therein; and the bill annulling the marriage of George Foster and Sarah his wife, of Washington county, were referred to the next General Assembly.

The bill for the relief of Sarah Ellis and her children, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Pechin, the question was put, That the words "all the right, title and interest of the said John Ellis to the said house and lot," be stricken out, for the purpose of inserting the words, "a title in fee simple to the said house and lot to the purchaser or purchasers thereof?" Resolved in the affirmative. The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass as amended? Resolved in the affirmative and sent to the senate.

The bill for the improvement of the revenue, was referred to the next General Assembly.

The report in favor of John Sprigg Belt was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

The report in favor of John Boone was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to lay out a road in Harford county, endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. Also, the bill fixing the mode in which any quota of militia hereafter to be furnished by this state for the common defence shall be raised; and the further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act to direct descents, severally endorsed, "will not pass." And a bill entitled, An act to alter the times of the meeting of the court of appeals, and for other purposes, endorsed, "will pass;" which was read.
