Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to the trustees of Hillsborough school, in Caroline county, on the first Monday of October, annually, or to their order, the sum of _____ dollars as a donation to said school.

On motion by Mr. Handy the following resolution was read assented to and sent to the senate.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Rev. Joseph Wyatt, the sum of one hundred dollars for his services as Chapline to the house of delegates the present session, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

On motion by Mr. Donaldson the following message was read, agreed to, and with the bill therein mentioned sent to the senate:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Jan. 2, 1812.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We send back to your honorable body the bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act for regulating the mode of staying executions, passed at November session seventeen hundred and ninety-one, and hope that upon a re-consideration thereof, you will be impressed with a sense of the necessity of applying a remedy to the mischief which that bill is calculated to remove, and will see the propriety of giving the same your concurrence.
