

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and the resolution therein contained assented to and sent to the senate.

Mr. Street delivers a bill entitled, An act to alter the time of holding the county court of Harford county; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

On the second reading of the bill further supplementary to the act entitled, An act for establishing a company for opening and extending the navigation of the river Potomack, on motion by Mr. Bowles the word "both" was stricken out of the said bill.

On motion by Mr. Bowles, the words "and the purposes of manufacture," were stricken out of said bill.

On motion by Mr. Bowles, the following was added to the said bill:

*"And whereas, persons owning land on the said branches, may be desirous to improve the same for the purpose of manufacture, the said president and directors are hereby fully authorised and empowered to grant to the said persons the privilege of using the surplus water for said purposes from time to time, as they may be required so to do."*

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass as amended? Resolved in the affirmative and sent to the senate.

Mr. Parnham delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Stephen Sanger of Charles county, which was read; The report in favor of Samuel Chase was read the second time and the resolution therein contained assented to and sent to the senate.

The bill confirming to Edward Bromwell, senr. of Talbot county, certain lots of land therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. F. Hall, the question was put, That the further supplement to the act entitled, "An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session eighteen hundred and five, be referred to the next general assembly." Determined in the negative.

The bill being read throughout, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative and the bill sent to the senate.

The bill to incorporate the congregation of United Brethren or Moravian church at Graceham in Frederick county; was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Swearingen, the report in favor of Sedgwick James, of Harford county, was referred to the next general assembly.

The bill to regulate the mode of qualifying jurors for the trial of civil actions in the county courts of this state, was read the second time, and the question put, Shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative and the bill sent to the senate.
