Bedford, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill to lay out a road from the Pennsylvania line to the Baltimore and Reister's town turnpike road, was referred to the next

general assembly.

The bill for the relief of Jacob Gettig of the city of Baltimore; the bill for the relief of William Jordan of the city of Baltimore; and the bill for the benefit of William Clinton, of Caroline county, were severally read the second time; passed and sent to the senate.

The report on the petition of Benjamin G. Jones, was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to and sent to the senate.

The report on the petition of Richard Proctor of Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time, and the resolution therein con-

tained assented to and sent to the senate.

The supplement to the act to ascertain and provide for the pay. ment of certain damages sustained by John Logsdon and others of Frederick county; the bill authorising Philemon C. Blake, late sheriff of Queen Ann's county, to complete his collection; the bill to empower Caroline Zollickoffer of Frederick county to exchange and lease out certain grounds in Baltimore county therein mentioned, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. T. B. Hall has leave of absence.

Mr. L. Duvall delivers a petition from Hyatt and Golder, counter to the petition of Alexis Romain; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by Mr. Bærstler, the following resolution was read the first and second time by special order, assented to and sent to

the senate:

Resolved. That the printer to the state print twenty five hundred copies of the militia law of this state, with marginal notes, stitched in form of octavo; and it shall be the duty of the executive of Maryland to forward as soon as possible, to each major-general ten copies; to each brigadier-general sixteen copies; to each commanding officer of a regiment forty copies; to each commanding officer of an extra-batallion, twenty copies; to be distributed to the commissioned officers of their respective regiments or extra-batallions as the case may be; and to each member of the legislature, two copies; and the treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to pay the expense of the same ont of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

The bill authorising any debtor and his creditor to enter m judgment before the clerk of any county court where the debtor shall reside during the recess of the county court was read the second time and the question put, Shall the said bill pass?
