So it was determined in the negative.

The supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate the stock holders of the Commercial and Farmers' Bank of Baltimore, was read the second time, and "will not pass;" which bill was sent to the senate.

The bill to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Cumberland Bank of Allegany, was read the

second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to authorise Owen Evans, guardian of the heirs at law of Jesse Brooks, deceased, to sell and convey certain lands therein mentioned, lying in Cecil county; the bill to confirm to Mary Wood of Anne-Arandel county, certain property therein mentioned; the bill for the relief of Stephen Ryner; the bill for the relief of Aquilla Miles of Harford county; the bill for the relief of Joseph Brown of the city of Baltimore; and the bill to extend M'Eldery-street, in the eastern preciats of Baltimore, severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. Also the further supplement to the act entitled, An act authorising a lottery in Havre-de-Grace, for the purpose therein mentioned; and the bill to regulate the inspection of salted fish in this state, severally endorsed, "will not pass." Also the resolution in favor of William Richardson, endorsed, "dissented from." And the following message:
