Which was read the first and second time by special order, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

Mr. F. Hall delivers a petition from Thomas Harrison, of Prince George's county, praying to be supported by said county; which was read and referred to Messrs. F. Hall, Herbert and Callis.

The report in favor of Samuel Brown, was read the second time and dissented from.

On the second reading of the bill to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the District of Columbia, toward the city of Washington, on motion by Mr. Herbert the question was put, That the amendments proposed by the committee to whom the same was referred be adopted? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Herbert the capital was reduced from one hundred thousand, to sixty thousand dollars, and the shares reduced from "fifty" to "twenty" dollars.

On motion by Mr. Howard the question was put, That the house reconsider the amendments proposed by the committee? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass as amended? Resolved in the affirmative.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill authorising the executors of Mary Yellot, to release certain mortgages therein mentioned, endorsed, "will not pass." The bill for the valuation of real and personal property in this state, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read. Also the resolutions in favor of William Richardson, Alexis Boone and Benjamin G. Jones, severally endorsed, "assented to." Also the resolution in favor of Richard Butler, and the resolution in favor of Thomas Reynolds and Richard Mackall, severally endorsed, "dissented from;" and the resolutions relative to chancellor Kilty's report of the English and British Statutes. endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read the first and second time by special order and assented to. Also the bill for the benefit of William Chilton, of Caroline county; and the bill to empower Caroline Zollickoffer, of Frederick county, to exchange and lease out certain grounds in Baltimore county therein mentioned, severally endorsed, "will not pass." Also the resolutions in favor of Cornelius Manning, Jubb Fowler and the examiner-general, severally endorsed, "as-
