The bill for the relief of John Walters, an insolvent debtor, of Queen Anne's county. The bill to authorise the corporation of the city of Annapolis, to repair certain wharves. The bill for the relief of George Lash, of the city of Baltimore. The bill for the benefit of Dennis M. Burgess, of Prince George's county; and the bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, severally endorsed, "will not pass." Also the resolution relative to extra per diem. The resolutions in favor of the messenger in chancery, John Sullivan and Henry Thompson, and the resolution relative to printing the cavalry bill, severally endorsed, "assented to;" and the resolutions in favor of Benjamin Johns, Thomas S. Brewer and Charles Sewell, severally endorsed, "dissented from"
