

Mr. Edward Lloyd appeared in the senate, and after qualifying agreeably to the constitution and form of government, took his seat.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act to empower the inhabitants of the town of Havre-de-Grace to elect the commissioners thereof, passed by that house Nov. 15, 1811; and a bill entitled, An act to prevent horses, cattle, sheep and swine from running at large within the limits therein described, passed by that house Nov. 16, 1811; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, An act authorising Mary Keene to remove her negroes from the state of Virginia into this state. The resolution in favor of Mary King; and the report of the visitors of Frederick county School, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, An act for the benefit of William Pollett, junior, of Somerset county, an insolvent debtor, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne Arundel county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Clarissa Smith, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Frederick county to appoint commissioners to lay out and open a road therein mentioned, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the council delivers a letter from the executive covering a communication from the commissioners appointed by the legislature of the state of New York, and their report of the rout of an inland navigation from Hudson's river to Lake Ontario and Lake Erie, which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections and to regulate said elections. *Ordered,* That Messrs. Lloyd, Dorsey and Mac Creery be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill entitled, An act to make valid the will of William Baird, late of Washington county, deceased, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act to give validity to a deed from George M'ulloch and Isabella his wife, to David Strohm; and a bill entitled, An act to authorise and direct the administrators of William Candler, late sheriff of Montgomery county, to execute a deed therein mentioned, severally passed by that house Nov. 18, 1811, which were severally
