THE Senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Thomas, president, appeared in the senate.

The bill entitled, An act for the relief of Dominick Galt and John Thomas of the city of Baltimore; the bill entitled, An act to authorise the drawing of a lottery or lotteries in Middle-town, in Frederick county; and the resolution relative to the purchase of Maxcy's edition of the laws of Maryland, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Upton Bruce appeared in the senate, and after qualifying agreeably to the constitution and form of government, took his seat.

The bill entitled, An act to prevent horses, cattle, sheep and swine from running at large within the limits therein described, was read the second time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act to empower the inhabitants of the town of Havre de-Grace to elect the commissioners thereof, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, *Ordered*, That the register in chancery be, and he is hereby required to lay before this house, as soon as circumstances will permit, a list of all suits now pending in the court of chancery, shewing the time they were instituted, and designating those affecting persons residing, or property lying on the Eastern shore.

The bill entitled, An act to give validity to a deed from George McCullough and Isabella his wife, to David Strohm, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, An act to empower Rebecca Candler and John Candler, administrators of William Candler, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, to collect fees and county tax put into his hands for collection during his lifetime, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
