whom I have been informed that the object of the resolution sent me, was to obtain such information as was in my power to give, relative to the number of suits in chancery which appear to hive parties on the Eastern Shore of Maryland. Anxious, at all times to comply, as far as in my power with any requisition made of me, I have gone through the docket, and find that there are 269 cases remaining on the docket where parties appear to reside on the Eastern Shore of Maryland; which are classed in the following order: There are 201 cases where the parties who reside in the state, all reside on the Eastern Shore; among those are induded all cases between parties residing out of the state and parties residing on the Eastern Shore, whether the non-residents be complainants or defendants. There are 21 cases where the complainants reside on the Eastern, and the defendants on the Western There are 16 cases where the complainants reside on the Western, and the defendants on the Eastern Shore; nine cases where the complainants reside on the Western Shore, and the defendants on the Eastern and Western Shores; and seven cases where the complainants reside on the Eastern, and the defendants on the Eastern and Western Shores. There are also fifteen cases of lunatics and insane persons under the care of the court, on the Eastern Shore; making in the aggregate 269 cases.
