The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act authorising commissioners to open the old road leading from Richard Owing's mill, in Anne-Arundel county, to Elk-Ridge church in Queen Caroline parish, passed by that house Nov. 26, 1811; a bill entitled, An act authorising the levy of a sum of money upon the assessable property in Queen Anne's and Caroline counties, for the purpose of building a bridge over the head waters of Tuckahoe creek, passed by that house November 27, 1811; and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Nov. 26, 1811.
