

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act separating the business of the court of chancery, and authorising the holding sessions of the said court for the Eastern Shore, and for other purposes. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Lloyd, Holbrook and Williams be a committee to prepare and bring in the same

On motion, *Ordered*, That the bill entitled, An act for the sale of the real estate of Abraham Larsh, late of Baltimore county, deceased, be referred to a special committee. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Brown, MacCreery and Dorsey be the said committee.

The bill entitled, An act for the relief of George Gassaway, of the city of Baltimore. The bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco; and the bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate said elections, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, *Ordered*, That the bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to build a church in Charles county, passed at November session eighteen hundred and seven, be referred to a special committee. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Lloyd, Frazier and MacCreery be the said committee.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned. A bill entitled, An act to erect a town in Montgomery county, and for other purposes. A bill entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Charles county to assess and levy a sum of money on the assessable property thereof, for the purpose of building a gaol in said county, severally passed by that house Nov. 30, 1811. A bill entitled, An act to increase the allowance of the justices of the orphans' court of the counties therein mentioned, passed by that house Dec. 2, 1811; and the following resolution:

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed and required to pay to Henry Spalding, late a private in the revolutionary war, or to his order, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a provision to him in his indigent situation and advanced life.
