The bill entitled, An act for the sale of the real estate of Abraham Larsh, late of Baltimore county, deceased, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed.

1st. After the word " Baltimore" in the 8th line of the 1st page, insert " and by affixing advertisements in the most public places in the neighborhood of said lands."

2d. Strike out from the word " of" in the 6th line of the 2d page, to the end of the line, and insert " one, two and three years."

3d After the word " them" in the 7th line of the 5th page, insert " except Susan Dickson's proportion or share, which shall be invested in the stock of some of the banks in the city of Baltimore, by the said Margaret Larsh and Abraham Larsh, or the survivor of them ; and the stock and profits thereof to be applied by the said Margaret Larsh and Abraham Larsh, or the survivor of them, as directed by the last will and testament of said Abraham Larsh, deceased.

4th. Strike out from the word " in" in the 9th line of the 5th page, to the end of the clause, and insert " stock in some of the banks in the state of Maryland.

On motion, *Ordered*, That the bill entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the district of Columbia toward the city of Washington, be re-committed.
