

of the city of Baltimore ; a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Sater T. Walker, an insolvent debtor of the city of Baltimore ; a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of James Cochran of Cecil county ; a bill entitled, An act to make valid a certain devise to the Methodist church in the city of Annapolis ; a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Littleton Dennis Teackle of Somerset county ; a bill entitled an act to appoint Thomas Harrison, of the city of Annapolis, trustee for the sale of certain real estate there mentioned ; a bill entitled, An act to authorise Edward Barton and William Kelly to alter and change the public road therein mentioned, in Caroline county ; a bill entitled, An act empowering the surveyors of the several counties of this state and their deputies, to qualify their chain and pole carriers, severally passed by that house December 9, 1811 ; and a bill entitled, An act to incorporate the humane impartial society of the city of Baltimore, passed by that house December 10, 1811 ; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution in favor of Samuel Thomas, was read the second time, and assented to with the proposed amendments.

*Amendments proposed.*

1st. Strike out the words " is hereby " in the eighth line of the resolution and insert " shall be."

2nd. Strike out the letter " s " in the word " judgments " in the eleventh line of the resolution.

3rd. After the word " judgments " in the eleventh line of the resolution insert " on his paying the principal with six per cent interest thereon."

4th Strike out the word " also " in the eleventh line of the resolution and insert " is hereby discharged from the nine per cent interest."

5th. At the end of the resolution add " Provided that the judgment aforesaid shall continue and be in force notwithstanding the suspension directed by this resolution."

On motion, *Ordered*, That the bill entitled, An act making an uniform provision for the surviving officers and soldiers of the late Maryland line in the revolutionary war, and for others, have a second reading to-morrow.

The bill entitled, An act for the relief of William R. Gilles, James Gilles and David Gilles ; and the bill entitled, An act for the relief of William Greetham, of the city of Baltimore, were severally read the second time and will pass.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
