

The bill entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Jonathan Cullings; the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Dempsey, of the city of Baltimore; the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Rufus Bigelow and John G. Proud; the bill entitled, A supplement to the act of seventeen hundred and eighty-five, and the supplementary acts thereto which provide for the poor of Dorchester county; the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Robert D. Allen, of the city of Baltimore; the bill entitled, An act empowering the justices of the levy court of Cecil county to appoint commissioners to review alter and amend the road therein mentioned; the bill entitled, An act to authorise a lottery for the purpose therein mentioned in Washington county; the bill entitled, An act for the relief of William R. Gilles, James Gilles and David Gilles; the bill entitled, An act for the relief of William Greetham, of the city of Baltimore; and the resolution in favor of Samuel Thomas, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, *Ordered*, That the second reading of the bill entitled, An act relating to the hospital in the vicinity of the city of Baltimore be postponed until Thursday the 19th inst.

The senate proceeded agreeably to their resolution to the second reading of the bill entitled, An act making an uniform provision for the surviving officers and soldiers of the late Maryland line in the revolutionary war, and for others; and the bill being read, the question was put, Shall it be referred to a special committee? Resolved in the affirmative. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Lloyd, Tabbs, and Frazier be the said committee.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act for the amendment of the law; a bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, severally passed by that house Dec. 10, 1811; a bill entitled, A supplementary act relating to insolvent debtors; a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of the heirs of James Cain, late of Harford county, deceased; and a bill entitled, An act authorising Thomas C. Worthington and William G. D. Worthington to sell the real estate of Thomas Contee, late of Prince George's county, deceased; severally passed by that house Dec. 11, 1811; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, An act for the benefit of the widow and infant children of Thomas Gibson, late of Frederick county, deceased; with the following message:
