Mr. Lloyd from the committee to whom was committed the bill entitled, An act separating the business of the court of chancery, and authorising the holding sessions of the said court for the Eastern Shore and for other purposes, reports the same with amendments. Whereupon the senate resumed the consideration of said bill, and it being amended and read through, the question was put, Shall this bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 9 o'clock.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 16, 1811.

THE Senate met.—Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Bruce and Mr. L. Hollingsworth. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. William Hollingsworth appeared in the senate.

Mr. Nathaniel Williams appeared in the senate, and after qualifying agreeably to the constitution and form of government and laws of this state, took his seat.

The bill entitled, An act to authorise Joseph Greenawalt and Emanuel Brower, of Frederick county, to sell and convey certain land therein mentioned was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed.

Strike out from the word "erected" in the 7th line of the 2d page, to the word "as" in the same line of the same page, and insert "may also be used."

The bill entitled, An act for the relief of Charles Farrow, of Somerset county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed.

After the word "judges" in the interlineation between the 3d and 4th lines of the bill, insert "or any one judge."

The bill entitled, An act to change the mode of repairing the public roads in Worcester county; and the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Rachel Mewshaw of Ann-Arundel county, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, An act to prevent the erection of booths within two miles of any Methodist camp or quarterly meeting in the several counties therein mentioned; and the bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, were severally read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
