not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a carpenter's hall in the city of Baltimore; a bill entitled, An act to authorise the sale and conveyance of certain property held in trust for the German Lutheran congregation of the city of Baltimore; and a bill entitled, A supplement to an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of making a permanent bridge over the river Monocacy, in Frederick country, severally passed by that house Dec. 16th, 1811; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
