The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act to enable Richard Trippe and Susannah Trippe, of Talbot county, to manumit certain negroes therein mentioned; a bill entitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act to erect Baltimore town in Baltimore county into a city, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof; and a bill entitled, An act to incorporate a manufacturing company in Talbot county on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, severally passed by that house Dec. 18, 1811; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, An act to authorise Stephen H. Ford and Grace Ford, to lease the freehold and leasehold estate of Ann Evans Hammond and William Hammond infants of the city of Baltimore; and the bill entitled, An act to empower Robert Casey and Elizabeth Casey, of the city of Baltimore, to lease the freehold and leasehold estate of Jane B. Hammond and John Hammond infants of the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes; were severally read the second time, and will not pass.

The bill entitled, A supplement to an act authorizing a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of making a permanent bridge over the river Monocacy, in Frederick county; the bill entitled, An act to authorise the sale and conveyance of certain property held in trust for the German Lutheran congregation, of the city of Baltimore; and the bill entitled, An act for the benefit of the heirs of Mark Guishard, late of Baltimore county, deceased; were severally read the second time, and will pass.

The bill entitled, An act to authorise a lottery or lotteries to raise a sum of money for the use of the library company of Baltimore was read the second time, and will not pass.
