

The bill entitled, An act authorising Solomon Hillen, jun. to retain in this state, and to import therein from New-Orleans and port of Florida, certain slaves, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favor of George W. Bradford was read the second time and dissented from. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, An act to authorise and empower Isaac Chandlee to mortgage a certain tract of land therein mentioned was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, An act to incorporate a manufacturing company in Talbot county on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

*Amendments proposed.*

1st. Strike out the word "association" in the 10th line of the 9th page and insert "act."

2d. Strike out from the word "the" in the 4th line of the last page to the word "and" in the 5th line of the same page, and insert "provisions of this act."

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to prevent the issuing and circulation of bank notes of a certain description. *Ordered*, That Messrs. N. Williams, Tabbs and MacCreery be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill entitled, An act for the benefit of James Hope, William Carriens, and Robert Cariens. devisees of Thomas McGettgen, late of Harford county, deceased, was read the second time passed with the proposed amendment and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

*Amendment proposed.*

After the words "William Cariens," wherever they occur in the bill, insert "junior."

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act to legitimate the acknowledged children of Peter Rouck and Jacob Kershner of Washington county; a bill entitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed November session eighteen hundred and five severally passed by that house December 19, 1811; and a bill entitled, An act to authorise a lottery for the benefit of Salisbury in Somerset and Worcester counties, passed by that house Dec. 20, 1811; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
