## BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 20, 1811.

Resolved, That all proceedings against Sutton Isaac Weems, and his securities on a judgment obtained against them on account of a balance due to the state by the said Sutton Isaac Weems, is sheriff of Calvert county, be and are hereby suspended until the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirteen; and also that the said Sutton Isaac Weems and his securities be, and they are hereby released from the payment of the nine per cent per annum of the fifteen per cent interest, chargeable on the principal of the balance due the state, on condition only that the said Sutton Isaac Weems and his securities shall punctually pay to the treasurer of the Western Shore, on or before the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirteen, the principal of the balance due the state, with interest on the same at the rate of six per cent per annum together with all costs on said judgment; Provided, That the
