The bill entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Salisbury, in Somerset and Worcester counties; and the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Marcus Heyland, an insolvent debtor of the city of Baltimore, were severally read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favor of Thomas E. Bond and William Robertson, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act for regulating writs of error and granting appeals from and to the courts of common law within this province; and a bill entitled, An act to repeal an act for the preservation of the breed of fish in Patuxent river, severally passed by that house December 24, 1811; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
