MONDAY, DECEMBER 30, 1811.

The senate met.—Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Bruce. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill and resolutions received from the house of delegates on Saturday, were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, An act for the opening and extending of Pratt street in the city of Baltimore, and the engrossed bills from No. 1 to No. 138 inclusive, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Frederick county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, An act for the relief of John McKenzie of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act for the relief of Dominick Galt and John Thomas, of the city of Baltimore, passed by that house Dec. 30, 1811; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Also delivers the following resolution :

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 30, 1811.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to the governor, or his order, the sum of one thousand dollars, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, for the purpose of furnishing the government-house.
