The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act authorising appropriations for the penitentiary of this state; and a bill entitled, An act for the encouragement of learning and erecting schools in the several counties within this state, severally passed by that house Dec. 31, 1811; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the council delivers a communication from the executive, covering a letter from the secretary of state of the United States, enclosing a copy of an act of congress for the apportionment of representatives among the several states according to the third enumeration; which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, An act to repeal all such parts of the acts of assembly of this state as require the payment of twenty five shillings for a marriage license, was read the second time and the

question put, Shall this bill pass?
