

12th. Strike out from the word "therein" in the 4th line of the 51st page to the end of the clause.

13th. Strike out the word "five" in the 6th line of the 70th page and insert "ten." Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read, the question was put, Shall this bill pass with the proposed amendments?

*Resolved in the affirmative*, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Joseph Brown, of the city of Baltimore; a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Samuel Cole, of the city of Baltimore, severally passed by that house Jan. 1, 1812; and the following resolutions:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 31, 1811.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay unto Edward Tillard, of Montgomery county, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, during life, a sum of money equal to the half-pay of a lieutenant-colonel, as a provision to him in his indigent situation, and as a further remuneration to him for those services rendered his country during our revolutionary war.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Jan. 1, 1812.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to the president and trustees of the Hager's Town Academy, or their order, on the first Monday of October next, and on every first Monday of October forever thereafter, the sum of eight hundred dollars, as a donation for the use of said academy, to be applied by the president and trustees to assist in paying the salaries of the teachers of said academy.

Also returns the bill entitled, An act to alter the time of the meeting of the General Assembly of this state, and for other purposes, endorsed, "by the house of delegates, Jan. 1, 1812;" read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment."

*Amendment proposed.*

Strike out the word "January" wherever it occurs in the bill and insert "December."

Which was read.
