The senate met.

The bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments was read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act for regulating writs of error and granting appeals from and to the courts of common law within this province; the bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state; the bill entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy on the assessable property of said county a sum of money to build a bridge over the great Falls of Gunpowder; and the bill entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Washington county, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act for regulating the mode of staying execution, passed at November session seventeen hundred ninety-one, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, the question was put, Will the senate re-consider the bill entitled, An act to prevent the issuing and circulation of bank notes of a certain description? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read, the question was put, Shall this bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Aquila Miles, of Harford county; a bill entitled, An act to confirm to Mary Wood, of Anne-Arundel county, certain property therein mentioned; a bill entitled, An act authorising Elizabeth Lockett, of Frederick county to remove certain negroes into the state of Maryland; a bill entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of salted fish in this state, severally passed by that house Jan. 1, 1812. And the following resolutions:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Jan. 1, 1812.

Resolved, That Edward Reynolds, executor of Thomas Reynolds, and Richard Mackall, surviving executor of Benjamin Mackall, of Calvert county, shall be authorised to lay before the auditor their claim as executors aforesaid, against the late William and Robert Mollison; and the auditor is hereby authorised and empowered to liquidate and adjust the same, and to ascertain the balance (if any) due thereon to the said Edward Reynolds, executor of Thomas Reynolds, and Richard Mackall; and the treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to pay to the said Edward Reynolds, executor of Thomas, and Richard Mackall surviving executor of Benjamin Mackall, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the amount of the balance so to be ascertained by the auditor; *Provided*, the sum so to be paid by
