*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to the trustees of St. Peter's Free School in the city of Baltimore, the sum of three thousand dollars; *Provided*, that the said trustees shall have given bond with security to be approved of by the governor and council, conditioned that they will re-pay the said sum of money to the state of Maryland into the treasury of the Western Shore on or before the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and fifteen, and that they will apply the said sum of money within six months after the same shall have been so advanced to them in the building and finishing the free-school of which they are the trustees.
