The resolutions relative to printing the militia law ; in favor of Richard Proctor and Samuel Chase, were severally read the second time, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolutions relative to purchasing Maxcy's laws, and in favor of state debtors, were severally read the second time, dissented from and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, An act for the encouragement of learning in Harford county, passed by that house Jan. 6, 1812 ; and the following resolutions :

Jacob, and each and every of them, or their order, the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars annually, during their lives, in quarterly payments, out of any unappropriated monies in the treasury.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore shall be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to subscribe on the part of the state on account of the stock reserved in the Commercial and Farmers Bank of Baltimore, twenty-five thousand dollars ; in the Hager's Town Bank five thousand dollars ; in the Elkton Bank of Maryland ten thousand dollars ; in the Merchant and Farmers' Bank of Baltimore fifteen thousand dollars ; in the Franklin Bank of Baltimore fifteen thousand dollars ; and in the Marine Bank of Baltimore ten thousand dollars ; and the amount thereof be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
