The senate proceeded to said election, and the ballots being deposited in the ballot-box, the committee appointed by the senate to join the committee appointed by the house of delegates, retired to the conference room, and after some time returned and reported that William Pechin had forty three votes as director in the Commercial and Farmers' bank of Baltimore; that Edward H. Veazey had forty-four votes as director in the Elkton bank of Maryland; and that Frisby Tilghman had forty five votes as director in the Hager's town bank. Whereupon, it appearing that William Pechin, Edward H. Veazey and Frisby Tilghman had a majority of votes of all the attending members of both branches of the legislature, it is declared in the senate, that William Pechin, in the Commercial and Farmers' bank of Baltimore; Edward H. Veazey in the Elkton bank of Maryland, and Frisby Tilghman in the Hager's-town bank, are duly elected directors on the part of the state.
