THE Senate met.

The engrossed bills No. 220, 221, were severally read, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the engrossed bills from No. 218 to No. 225 inclusive (with the exception of 220, 221) severally assented to by that house Jan. 7, 1812; which were severally read, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk. Also returns the engrossed bills No. 220, 221, severally assented to by that house, Jan. 7th, 1812.

His excellency the governor attending in the senate, *Ordered*, That Messrs. Lloyd and Tabbs wait upon the house of delegates, and inform them his excellency is attending in the senate chamber for the purpose of signing and sealing the engrossed bills, and request their attendance.

The Speaker, attended by the members of the house of delegates appeared in the senate, and the following engrossed bills were presented by the speaker to his excellency the Governor, who signed and sealed the same in the presence of both houses.

No. 1. An act to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the council for the ensuing year.

2. A supplement to an act passed at November session eighteen hundred and nine, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments.

3. An act authorising the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose of repairing the Liberty-town road.
