Resolved, That in the event of the amount of any unappropriated money in the treasury being inadequate to the necessary expenditure to be incurred by virtue of the foregoing resolutions, the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby empowered and required to obtain a loan from any of the banks in this state, on such terms as may be approved by the governor and council: *Provided*, the amount of such loan shall not exceed the expenditure authorised by the foregoing resolutions.

WEDNESDAY, June 17, 1812.

The house met—Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Samuel Burgess, a delegate returned for Queen-Anne's county, appeared and took his seat in the house.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from Jehu Chandler, printer to the state, praying for a determination of the legislature, whether he is bound to forward to each magistrate, one copy of the votes and proceedings, agreeably to an order of the house of delegates, passed at November session, 1794; which was read, and the question put, that the same be referred to a committee. Resolved in the affirmative. Ordered, that Messrs. Donaldson, Marriott and Stevens, be the said committee.

The bill authorising the several banks in this state to loan money to the United States, was read the second time by special order, and on motion by Mr Wilson, the question was put, that the following be added to the said bill:

“Provided always, that no loan shall be made by any bank under the licence given by this law, until after a new election of directors.”
