The clerk of the senate delivers the following resolution:

BY THE SENATE, June 17, 1812.

Whereas, It appears by a report made by the governor and council, to the General Assembly, at the last November session, that a great number of the arms belonging to the state has been delivered out at different times by orders of the governor and council to officers of the militia, and it is deemed expedient at this time to know the state and condition of said arms: Therefore,
