3d. Every member who shall deliver his opinion or speak in any debate, shall rise uncovered, an respectfully address himself to the speaker.

4th, No member at the time of speaking in debate shall name any other by his proper name, b

aball use some other distinction.

5th. If two or more members shall rise to speak at the same time, the speaker shall determine which shall speak first. 6th. No member shall speak a second time, until every member who offers to deliver his sent

ments has spoken once. 7th, Any member called to order by the speaker, or any member, shall thereupon take his seat. 8th. When the house is sitting, no member shall hold conversation to interrupt debate.

9th. No motion shall be debated until the same be seconded, and, (if desired by the speaker or an

member) reduced to writing, delivered in at the table, and read by the clerk.

10th. When a motion is made and seconded, the matter of the motion shall receive a determination by the question, or be postponed by a motion for commitment or postponement, or by the pr vious question, before any other motion shall be received.

11th. Every question shall be entered on the journal, and the yeas and nays shall be taken, who

required by three members who shall have divided on the question.

The previous question, that is, whether the question propounded be now put, may be call for by any member on any question, except to an amendment, or other matter which cannot its nature be postponed.

13th. If a question in debate contains more distinct parts than one, any member may of right, ha

the same divided into as many questions as parts.

11th. All questions shall be determined by a majority of the members present, those dividing in t affirmative rising in their places, those in the negative continuing in their seats, and so vice ver until a decision by the speaker.

15th. Whenever the speaker shall decide any question, the same shall be final, unless the year a

nays be required,

16th. Every bill or resolution originated in this house, or received from the senate, shall be read two several days, with an intermission of one day at least, during which time it shall lie on table for the perusal of the members, unless on very urgent occasions the house shall, by spec order, dispense with this rule; which order shall be entered on the journal.

17th. Conferrees, and members appointed on drafts, if required by three members, shall be elect

by ballot, and the number in no case shall exceed seven.

13th No hill or resolve shall have a second reading until every member in the city be called up to attend, except he be excused by the house for indisposition, or necessary attendance on public business.

19th No petition, memorial or other application to the house, shall be received, unless present

by a member.

20th. All questions of order shall be determined by the speaker; but there may be an appeal any member, to the house, from the decision, and the determination of the house in such ca of appeal, shall be final.

21st. No motion shall be made after the hour of adjournment, without leave of the house.

22d. All misdemeanors which shall happen in the house shall be censured or fined by the house. 23d. No member shall answer on the year and nays who did not divide on the question; and if a member divides on one side, and answers on the other on the year and nays, the same shall noted on the journal at the request of any member.

24th. All fines imposed by the house, shall be paid to the clerk, and applied as the house shall

rect.

23th. The substance of all petitions, memorials or other applications, shall be entered on the jo 25th. The clerk of the house shall, during the first week of the session, put into the hands of

speaker, a correct list of all papers referred from the preceding session. 27th. On motion or debate, any member may call for the reading of any law, journal, record

other public proceeding, which may relate to the subject matter.

28th. No member shall take out of the house any bill, or other paper belonging to the house, w out the leave of the speaker, under the penalty of such fine as may be imposed by the speak not exceeding forty shillings; and no original paper shall be delivered to any person during recess of the legislature.

23th. No member shall nominate more than one person on any committee, and in making su

nonjugation, shall rise and address himself to the speaker.

30th. On an election to any office of trust or profit, no ballot shall be counted unless the person whom the ballot shall be given, be named to the house before the balloting be gone into.

31st. All the members present shall divide on every question, unless excused by the house; on calling the yeas and nays, his refusal shall be noted on the journal, at the request of member.

32d. Whenever a motion shall be made, or question propounded to the house, and not seconded, other business shall be received until the speaker shall inform the house that the motion or position first made is not seconded.

33d. No motion for reconsideration shall be permitted, unless made and seconded by two members

who were in the majority on the original question. 34th. When a blank is to be filled up, and different sums, numbers or times shall be proposed, question shall be first taken on the largest sum or number, and on the latest time.

25th. When the house adjourne, every member shall rise in his place, and remain until the spec
