

On motion by Mr. Potter, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to repeal a supplement to an act entitled, An act to ascertain the allowance of the members of the General Assembly, electors of the Senate, and electors of President and Vice President of the United States, passed at November session eighteen hundred and eleven. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Potter, Bowles and Hambleton be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the house proceeded to ballot for an Auditor to the State; the ballot being deposited in the ballot box, the gentlemen named to strike retired, and after some time returned and reported that Thomas Harrison was unanimously elected.

Mr. Plater delivers a report of the trustees of the Charlotte Hall School, which was read and referred to Messrs. Plater, Parnham, Somervell, Turner and Millard.

On motion by Mr. Bayly, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to provide for the election of the justices of the levy courts in the several counties of this State by the people. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Bayly, Wilson, Potter, Griffith and Hambleton be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Lecompte moved the following order.

Ordered, That the committee of claims furnish to each member of the legislature, during this session, such one of the papers published in this city as the members may respectively direct.

On motion by Mr. Emerson, that the order be amended so as to read as follows. *Ordered*, That the committee of claims furnish to each member of the legislature during this session, the two papers published in this city, the question was put that the house agree to the amendment. Determined in the affirmative.

The question was then put that the house assent to the order as amended, and determined in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, *Ordered*, That the committee to whom the leave was given to bring in a bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, An act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts, be instructed to enquire into, and report to this house, the condition of the records in the office of the court of chancery, and whether the papers required by law to be recorded therein have been so recorded.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the house proceeded to the second reading of the order relative to printing of such papers as this house may order to be printed during the present session.

On motion by Mr. L. Duvall, the question was put, that the following words be added to the order viz: "and that they be and are hereby directed and instructed to employ Jehu Chandler, the printer to the State;" determined in the negative.

The question was then put that the said order be adopted.

Mr. Potts delivers a bill entitled, An act to open a road from New Town to Buckey's-Town, thence into the turnpike road at New Market; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.
