The report on the petition of Leonard Watkins, of Montgomery county, was read the second time concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

Mr. Stansbury delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of the eastern precincts of Baltimore praying the extension of Low-street ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Stansbury, Harryman, Donaldson, Randall and Barney.

Mr. Stansbury delivers a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act to lay out and make a public road in Baltimore county, passed the twentieth of January, eighteen hundred and eight which was read.

The report on the petition of Elijah Smith, of Dorchester county, was read the second time, concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

The clerk of the senate delivers the resolution in favor of John Chance and John Watkins, endorsed, " assented to ;" and the bill for the relief of John and Rebecca Candler ; the bill for the extension of Green street in the city of Baltimore ; the bill to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution as form of government as relate to the division of Allegany county into election districts ; and the bill for the relief of Cornelius Ennis, John Hancock and Charity Tarr, of Worcester county, several endorsed, " will pass " Ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Ford delivers a petition from John Davis, an old soldier, praying relief ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Ford, Parnham and Dorsey.

According to the order of the day, the house proceeded to the second reading of the bill entitled An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several Banks in the city of Baltimore ; and on motion by Mr. Dorsey the question was put, that the following section of the bill be stricken out, viz.

For the purpose of raising a fund to complete said road, BE IT ENACTED, That the charters of the several Banks now established in the city of Baltimore and Washington and Allegany counties shall be, and hereby are extended to the first day of November 1835, and to the end of the next session of the General Assembly thereafter, upon condition of their subscribing for as much stock as will raise a fund necessary and sufficient to finish and complete the said road, each Bank subscribing in proportion to the amount of capital actually employed, subscribed up, or in operation by them, and to be paid or advanced in due proportion to the amount by each Bank subscribed, in such periods and at such times as the same may be wanted ; and any increase of capital made by any of the said Banks shall at all succeeding payments thereafter, be taken into consideration, and be considered as a part of the capital contemplated under the act. The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow :

So it was resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Bowles, the question was put, That the further consideration of the bill be postponed until Wednesday the 9th instant? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the house proceeded to the second reading of the bill for the encouragement of learning and erecting schools in the several counties within this State ; and on motion by Mr. Lecompte, the question was put, that the first enacting clause be stricken out for the purpose of inserting the following : " That the judges of the orphans' court of the several counties in this State be, and they are hereby authorised and required at their first meeting after the first Monday in October next, and at their first meeting after the first Monday in October in every fifth year thereafter, to appoint five sensible and discreet persons in each election district of the said respective counties, as trustees for the district schools established by this act ; and a certificate of such appointment signed by the Register of Wills, shall be forwarded to each of the persons so appointed, who thereupon shall be invested with all the rights and powers, and subject to the duties prescribed by this act." Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Young, the question was put, that the following section be stricken out of the bill, to wit : " For the purpose of carrying this act into operation, BE IT ENACTED, That the charters of the several Banks now established in this State, shall be and are hereby extended to the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, and to the end of the next session of the General Assembly thereafter, upon condition that the said several Banks shall elect and bind themselves to pay into the treasury of the Western Shore, the sum of thirty thousand dollars for each and every year during the continuance of their respective charters as aforesaid under this law ; the sum so aforesaid to be paid by the said Banks shall be in proportion to their respective capitals actually paid or to be paid in ; and which sums as aforesaid shall be and they are hereby pledged as a fund for the purpose of supporting county schools. Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Young, the question was put, that the following section be inserted :

For the purpose of procuring a fund to carry this highly interesting object into effect, BE IT ENACTED, That an annual tax shall be and is hereby laid on the whole amount of the actual capital stock now paid or which may hereafter be paid into the following Banks, to wit : On the Bank of Maryland, twenty five cents on every hundred dollars of the actual capital stock of said Bank ; on
